2009 MID-CAREER FACULTY ACHIEVEMENT Award

Sponsored by the Family Medicine Education Consortium

The Family Medicine Education Consortium (FMEC), through its STFM:Northeast Region Meeting, seeks to support mid-career faculty with expertise in an area relevant to Family Medicine. It is our intention to identify and acknowledge one mid-career (i.e., five to twelve years of academic experience) faculty member each year who has demonstrated significant achievement. There are currently few opportunities for midcareer faculty to be recognized for their efforts. The intent of this recognition is to assist faculty who have not yet received tenure approval or otherwise been highly recognized for their efforts.

Achievement Measures: To receive recognition through this award, a faculty member may have:

- Written articles, books, manuscripts or other academic materials which reveal a significant intellectual contribution to the field of Family Medicine and health care in general;
- Designed and implemented curricular innovations which have made a significant impact on learners such as faculty, residents, students, patients and their family members and/or the community at large. These innovations should include impact studies describing the effectiveness of their intervention;
- Designed and implemented health care programs which have had a measurable impact on those served by the program;
- Designed and implemented research and other scholarly initiatives that have contributed to the scientific inquiry within an area of interest to the field of Family Medicine and health care in general;
- Designed and implemented administrative programs that have had a demonstrable effect on the productivity of the organizations in which they were implemented.

Nomination Process: We seek nominations from current FMEC Members. A nomination should include a letter summarizing the individual's contribution and a copy of the nominee's resume. **Nominations will be received through May 15, 2009.** A panel drawn from the membership of the Family Medicine Education Consortium will review the nominations. The nominee should currently be active in one of the various programs and departments of Family Medicine within the northeast region of the US. Senior faculty members (i.e. faculty members who have been approved for tenure or who have received substantial recognition from national organizations) will not be considered for this recognition.

Recognition: The individual selected for this recognition will be asked to summarize his/her work during a Seminar session at the upcoming 2009 STFM: Northeast Region meeting in Rye Brook, NY, October 30 - November 1, 2009. The individual selected for this recognition will receive **free registration** to the conference and **two complimentary hotel nights** at the hotel.

Assistant Professor of Family Medicine and Associate Director for Predoctoral Education in the Department of Family Medicine at Boston University...Her current position is evenly split between clinical work, teaching, and research. Fluent in Spanish, she sees primarily Latino patients in the faculty clinic at Boston Medical Center and participates in the inpatient rounding system. Her predoctoral work involves teaching medical students at all levels and running an innovative pipeline program, FaMeS, which to date has doubled the number of students applying in Family Medicine from Boston University.

Her research is centered on the improvement of primary care quality markers, particularly cancer screening, for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). She has been awarded a grant from the American Cancer Society to study mammography in women with IDD, has been a planner and facilitator of the Medical Homes preconference at the STFM: Northeast Region Meeting since 2006, and is a member of the Board of Directors of the ARC of Massachusetts.
