#### **COVID Protocols and Other Policies**

Please review all <u>FMEC Annual Meeting Policies</u> before you come to the meeting. Please note that this includes our <u>COVID-19 policy</u>, which requires proof of COVID-19 vaccination or a negative COVID-19 PCR test administered within 48 hours of the meeting.

Before you go to the FMEC registration desk, you must show proof of your vaccination at the COVID check-in table. A vaccination card or image on your phone is acceptable. During the meeting, masking will be encouraged but not required.

## Adherence to the Residency Fair Schedule

The Residency Fair will not be opened to students and should not be staffed by your program director or faculty until 7:00 pm on Friday and 4:45 pm on Saturday. The FMEC does not want students or faculty to be distracted from the academic presentations, for their own benefit and for that of the speakers. Therefore, we discourage setup on Friday afternoon during the academic sessions, and we do not allow people into the Residency Fair room all day Saturday until the Residency Fair officially begins. Please focus your attention on the academic sessions and the excellent content that the presenters have prepared.

### Giveaways

The FMEC asks that items distributed from the residency fair booths be primarily educational and/or informational about the program and its community. Modest trinkets or giveaways such as pens, hand sanitizers, and small candies are acceptable, however, we discourage programs from handing out items that are large or very valuable (such as t-shirts or gym bags), or any items that may cause a nuisance by being loud or difficult to clean up.
