





IMPLICIT & National MCH Efforts

IMPLICIT in Minnesota

Health Equity

- Importance of Health Equity
- Analysis of ICC Behavior Change with Health Equity focus

Family Planning PDSA and PATH

- Continue to monitor PDSA
 - Ensure all sites remove of "Tier" language, split intervention, making "Yes, reviewed current method satisfaction" its own option, adding "emergency contraception" as a method choice
- PATH (Patient-centered contraception education)
 - Educational package will be sent out and includes:
 - Presentation on the PATH method for patient-centered contraception counseling, patient-centered contraception educational material, video example of using PATH during an ICC visit

Promote IMPLICIT

- FMEC is partnering with IMPLICIT to strategize and seek funding opportunities via public health grants and private foundations
- Analyze and leverage ACGME requirements when seeking funding opportunities
- Identify new grant opportunities and work to publish on current data/projects

New site recruitment

- Identify providers and sites interested, hold group webinar
- Create comprehensive membership support documentation

Data Review

- Monitor previous PDSA's: Family Planning and Maternal Demographics
- Collaborate with HEC on analyzing health equity data
- Assist in increasing Network publications
- Move 4TM project to Phase 1 for current sites and prepare new sites interested in implementing
- Identify grants/collaboration appropriate for our data
- Revisit copywrite for Network Toolkit

Health Equity

- Assessing areas of opportunity to connect sites with community programs and partnerships
- Developing content for site leaders to disseminate to staff and residents around health equity and reproductive justice in family medicine
- Providing educational opportunities, centered on health equity, through webinars, journal club, and network meetings as it pertains to the postpartum experience
- Provide statements to use for Network presentations on gender inclusive language

Scholarly Activity

- Continuing the promotion of journal clubs and webinars
- Assisting in organization and outlining for 4th Trimester and ICC Behavior Changes publication topics with Network members

Leadership Council

- Continue identifying national health equity partners
