FMEC Announces 2025 Poster Presentation Winners

DAYTON, OHIO – Each year, at the Annual Meeting of the Family Medicine Education Consortium (FMEC), the best scientific posters are presented with awards to recognize their excellence.

The FMEC 2025 Annual Meeting was held September 18-20, 2025, at the Huntington Convention Center in Cleveland, OH. Nearly 950 family practice faculty, residents and medical students attended the meeting. They represented over 100 residency programs and over 50 medical schools, primarily in the northeast region of the United States.

A total of 136 posters were accepted for presentation at the meeting. The FMEC recognized 1st-3rd places. All posters were accepted in the spring and summer of 2025 for their relevance and importance to the field of family medicine, and they were judged for their visual impact, clarify of message, readability and other factors by a panel of family physician reviewers.
