## **Meeting Attendees**

As of mid-August 2022, the FMEC expected 800 attendees at the 2022 Annual Meeting, including almost 300 medical students, 200 residents, 250 faculty and other post-training health professionals, 40 exhibit staff, and others. As of August 25th, 86 residency programs had registered for the Residency Fair. The unique nature of the meeting means that while many program directors and faculty have attended for many years, as much as 60% of the attendees are students or residents who may be new to the FMEC. # Description of Presentation Formats

## Workshops (2 hours)

Workshops are designed to transmit specific skills and are directed toward learning methodologies and strategies for approaching problems in teaching students, residents and faculty. The participants should be actively involved and should be able to acquire an understanding of various approaches to these problems.

## Seminars (1 - 1.5 hours)

Seminars are designed to transmit specific knowledge in a given area and consist of a combination of formal presentations and group discussions.

# Research and Quality Improvement

## (30 minutes)

These presentations report rigorously-designed investigations or quality improvement activities and are followed by a moderated discussion.

# Paper Presentations (15 minutes)

Paper presentations provide an opportunity to present to a wide audience about research, scholarship, curricular design, teaching programs, community service, and any other topic of interest related to family medicine. Both completed projects and those under development may be presented. They are typically grouped into an hour–long session featuring four presentations.

## Lecture Discussions (20 minutes)

The Lecture Discussion format involves a 20-minute presentation to share information that relates to a clinical, educational or policy topic, report of a project and/or activity, or introduction of a policy issue, along with time for participant discussion. They are typically grouped into an hour-long session featuring three presentations.

## Posters (60 minutes per session)

Scientific posters are presented on various topics of interest in family medicine, with authors available for discussion.

## Speed Presentations (7 minutes)

This format provides the presenter 7 minutes and a maximum of 5 slides to share ideas and information in a focused, direct manner, followed by discussion. They are typically grouped with 4–6 in an hour–long session.

## Clinical Camp Tables (45 minutes per session)

This format is an opportunity to watch and participate in a handson demonstration of a clinical procedure commonly performed in family medicine, using patient models and materials.

## Breakfast Table Discussions (45 minutes)

Breakfast Table Discussions is an opportunity during the Saturday breakfast for scholarly and networking discussions. The title of the table is the topic, and presenters may provide brief opening remarks but generally facilitate discussion of the topic.

# Noetic Medicine: The Impact of Ideas on Health and Healing - Steve Bierman, MD

Noetic medicine is an emerging and maverick discipline that recognizes the profound impact of ideas on health and healing. As such, it represents a significant departure from the traditional materialistic/reductionist view of human beings – a view held sacred by the prevailing scientism of the day. Specifically, noetic medicine maintains that the ideas and communications of a caregiver can have significant effects on the mental and physical outcomes of any given intervention; while the ideas of the patient can and often do contribute to the etiology of disease. As Dr. Bierman will explain in this remarkable talk, noetic medicine is the missing element with the potential to set family physicians apart in a manner both precious and profound.



**Steve Bierman, MD,** whose work blends humanism, hypnosis and alternative modalities with traditional allopathic medicine, has been featured on NBC's Dateline and recently won the 2020 Best Indie Book award for his ground-breaking book, HEALING – Beyond Pills & Potions (Gyro Press, International). A graduate of the Northwestern University School of Medicine, Dr. Bierman began his career as a double board-certified Emergency and Family Physician but discovered that what he had spent his first 29 years learning and studying was simply not enough. Dr. Bierman now understands the tremendous impact of ideas on health and healing—ideas held by patients, and ideas delivered by caregivers.

Achieving a Healthy Population: REBRAND Family Medicine - Barbara Ross-Lee, DO, FACOFP

Dr. Ross -Lee's discussion will focus on the lack of alignment of the economic model of the healthcare system with population health, health inequities and health disparities, and the value of family medicine to 'health.' She will address critical topics such as personal health education, prevention, coordinated care, and collaborative care, while also discussing health policies/ regulations that support increased access, lower costs, unbiased institutional behaviors and positive quality of care outcomes.

**Barbara Ross-Lee, DO, FACOFP** is a nationally-recognized expert on health policy issues and serves as an advisor on primary care, medical education, minority health, women's health, and rural health care issues on the federal and state levels. She served as Vice President for Health Sciences and Medical Affairs (VPHSMA) at NYIT from 2001 until 2017, while also serving as interim Dean of the College of Osteopathic Medicine and interim Dean of the School of Health Professions. In



2014, Dr. Ross-Lee became the Inaugural Dean for NYITCOM at A-State, where she also served as CEO of its Academic Health Centers and President of its Faculty Practice Plan while continuing service as VPHSMA of NYIT. She is the founding director of the AOA Health Policy Fellowship Program and the Founding Director of the Training in Policy Studies (TIPS) for osteopathic resident physicians. Dr. Ross-Lee is the first African American woman to serve as dean of a United States medical school (Ohio University Heritage College of Osteopathic Medicine, 1993 – 2001) and the first osteopathic physician to participate in the Robert Wood Johnson Health Policy Fellowship. Dr. Ross-Lee currently serves as President of the American Osteopathic Foundation.

# Removing the Kryptonite: Unleashing Family Medicine's Superpowers – Robert Phillips, MD, MSPH

Family medicine has many superpowers, but the health system weakens us and our capacity to deliver high-quality, meaningful care. There is a stark opportunity to remove the kryptonite that blunts our superpowers thanks to the recent report on primary care by the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine (NASEM) and the many novel models of primary care that are quickly shaping the market. Students, residents, and family medicine educators have the power to help shape this evolution and to aim for careers that enable their superpowers!

Robert Phillips, MD, MSPH directs the Center for Professionalism and Value in Health Care in Washington, DC, which



aims to create space in which patients, health professionals, payers, and policymakers can work to renegotiate the social contract. Prior to being named executive director of the center in 2018, Dr. Phillips was the American Board of Family Medicine (ABFM) Vice President for Research and Policy. From 2004 until 2012, Dr. Phillips was the director of the Robert Graham Center, a health policy research center in Washington, DC. Dr. Phillips was elected to the National Academy of Medicine in 2010 and has served the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine (NASEM) in several capacities. In 2012, the health policy research fellowship co-sponsored by the Robert Graham Center and Georgetown University was renamed the Robert L. Phillips, Jr. Health Policy Fellowship. He was named to the University of Florida College of Medicine Hall of Fame in 2016.

# + About This Year's Meeting Theme

The 2022 theme was chosen to recognize the strengths, accomplishments, and potential of family medicine, and it is particularly relevant given the last two years of challenges brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Family medicine develops skills and knowledge that are truly "super." Family physicians provide the majority of care for America's underserved rural and urban populations. They diagnose and treat illness in all ages, and provide preventive care, health-risk assessments, immunizations and screenings, and personalized counseling on maintaining a healthy lifestyle. The family physician is able to leap from immunizing a toddler to treating adult hypertension in a single bound (which may simply be down the clinic hallway and into the next exam room).

As any movie or comic book lover knows, superheroes often face their own challenges, and for family physicians, staying abreast of a growing scope of health threats, compounded by issues such as work/ life balance and stress, can be very demanding. The FMEC Annual Meeting provides the opportunity for family physicians to connect, learn from each other, and become inspired to fight the next day's challenge. We are pleased you have joined us and hope you leave the meeting renewed, refreshed and ready to be "super" for another day.


